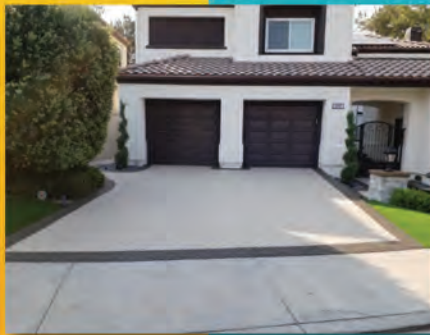

Unfortunately, the neighborhood experienced a low voter turnout again, which affects all residents. A few individuals select who serves on the Board, and that group then decides the future for the entire community.

At the Board Organizational Meeting held on Monday, May 4, Donna Griffith was elected president. I will now serve as vice president, Clara Lau remains as treasurer, and Jim Syptkowski continues as secretary. Along with our fellow directors, we remain committed to the professional governance of SCA.

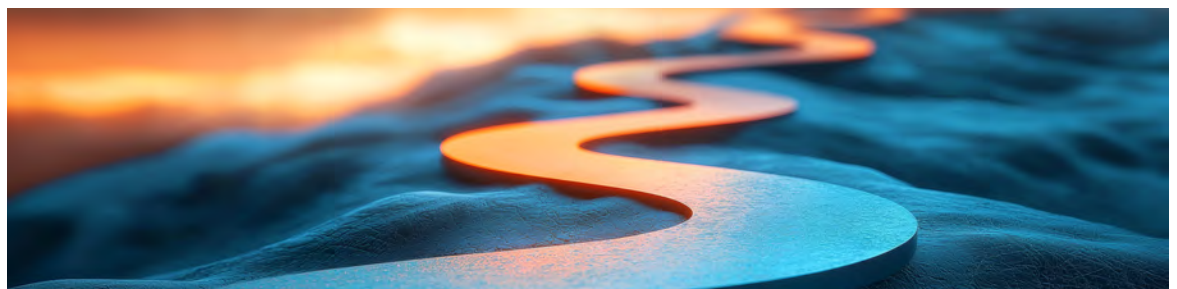
My time as president required a significant dedication of time, a deep study of law and local issues, and addressing controversial agenda items. I had to know

exactly where any debate was headed prior to the open meeting and maintain a clear sense of direction on every agenda item.

I hope the community feels that I served them well. I look forward to assisting the Association in my new role by helping to develop a fiscal plan that covers the next five years. I will introduce an initiative to increase the reserve cash cover, which currently sits between 70% to 80%. In 2030, several large items will enter the reserve. We must cover those items through either a special assessment at that time or by funding them now with excesses from assessments and unallocated Asset Enhancement Funds (AEF). My target is to reach 100% by 2030 to avoid any special assessments.

Thanks for the support of the Board this past year.

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW

The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) approves the homeowner modifications that are in compliance with the Design Guidelines and the Rules and Regulations (DG&RR). The Design Guidelines provide a framework and a comprehensive set of standards for home alterations and additions, and they set the criteria for the design, style, materials, colors, and location. These guidelines also list the orderly process for submitting, reviewing, and gaining the approval of proposed changes.

If you wish to make external changes to your lot, including painting, read and understand the Association governing documents, specifically the Design Guidelines. Homeowners may submit a signed and dated Architecture Change Application to the Community Standards Department along with signed plans, drawings, blueprints, and any supplemental materials related to the modification project.

Review the complete Design Guidelines by visiting the ARC webpage under the Governance tab on the SCA website,

scahoa.com. For any questions, contact the Community Standards Department at 702-614-5820 to request a consultation with an ARC member.

Application submission

In lieu of homeowners attending the ARC meetings, residents can email their applications and plans to ARC-Committee@scacai.com, send them by UPS or USPS, or drop them off at one of the lockboxes located outside Anthem, Independence, or Liberty Centers. Only one set of documents needs to be submitted. Once received, projects are reviewed at the next scheduled meeting, and the homeowner will be notified of the results.

The homeowner should be available by phone during the plan review time. If you will not be available at the phone number listed on your application, it is very important that you submit a phone number where you may be reached during this time, as an ARC member may call and request necessary clarification of your application for it to be approved.

The Community Standards staff and volunteers look forward to continuing to assist the members of SCA in maintaining the aesthetics of our community.

Committee Reports

COMMUNITY LIFESTYLE

The Community Lifestyle Governance Committee (CLC) monitors and supports SCA's clubs and assists with the formation of new ones. We advise on policies, procedures, guidelines, and the use of Association facilities for clubs. We work with the clubs that sponsor many activities and events. Each club has a CLC liaison who is the first contact for a club that has concerns or questions, wishes to amend a club charter, or add a new activity that must fit the mission of their charter and be approved by this committee.

This month, clubs are completing their scheduling requests for 2027, which are due by August 1. Last year, 15 clubs failed to submit their requests by the deadline. Even if a club intends to maintain its 2026 schedule or requires no space at all, the form must be returned. When listing an event—whether for club members, a resident-only function, or a publicly open activity—include a detailed description of the event. After approving resident and public events, the committee provides an extra promotion form. Club events are promoted only through the individual club because they are intended solely for members and their guests. Always provide specific dates rather than just the day of the week.

A common misconception is that early submission ensures priority. However, scheduling follows a specific order: **1.** BOD; **2.** Governance committees; **3.** Work groups and service groups; **4.** Administration; **5.** Clubs; **6.** Resident rentals; and **7.** Non-resident rentals.

Last year, clubs submitted approximately 4,000 separate space requests. When all other groups were included, that figure exceeded 5,000. If a club holds regular activities three to seven days a week and wishes to add multiple social gatherings, it must consider limited facility space, required setup time, and staffing constraints, as well as being fair to all 62 clubs. While Association space and staff levels remain unchanged, the volume of requests increases annually.

The new Sun City Anthem Club Policy Manual and Club Procedure Manual are now in effect. Consult scahoa.com on the club page for these documents, individual club information, and links to external club websites, email contacts, and forms. Our clubs play a vital role in our community, showcasing the creativity and talent of members who contribute greatly to our collective experience.

Purpose and procedure

The Covenants Committee meets monthly with two primary objectives: first, to fulfill the requirement for a Deed Restriction Enforcement Committee as outlined in Article 5.2 of the Bylaws, and second, to determine if violations exist concerning Section 3.26 (Bylaws) and Article 7.4 (Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions).

Violation review process

The committee reviews alleged violations of the governing rules and regulations. By examining all relevant data, the committee determines if a violation exists and whether to impose fines or sanctions. During the monthly hearings, the alleged violator has the right to appear in person or to respond in writing and present additional information. All discussions and reviews are confidential; consequently, the meetings are not open to the general public unless someone is specifically invited.

Notification and appeal

Following deliberation and a decision, the alleged violator is properly notified. This notice includes any specific fines or sanctions, if applicable. If a violation is confirmed, the violator is given time to remedy the violation and thus avoid all fines and sanctions. If the violator disagrees with the committee's decision, it can be appealed to the Board of Directors.

Financial update

Reporting has been slower than planned due to accounting integration challenges with the Global Northstar system. Nonetheless, the Finance Committee (FC) continues to work closely with the Management team to review unaudited data as soon as it becomes available. There are no material variances or concerns to report at this time; the financial health of SCA is excellent.

At the April SCA Board meeting, the Masterpiece Cuisine (MPC) contract was extended for one year, from May 1, 2026, to April 30, 2027. Food service will expand to five days per week, Monday to Friday, with lunch served from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. and dinner served from 4 to 7 p.m. Bar service will run continuously, with happy hour beginning at 3 p.m. as before. Lunch will offer a soup and salad bar, plus select sandwich choices with steak fries. Dinner will remain a buffet-style offering with the option of a few alternate entree choices.

In addition, MPC will provide an expanded SCA scope of work which includes a proposal for table service at dinner within about

120 days after which the FC will evaluate costs versus benefits and submit a proposal to the Board for consideration. Please support the restaurant. Lunch, happy hour, and dinner are quite good, and the venue is a great social hub in the evenings. The presence of live music on select nights further enhances the experience.

As this report is read, a new Board will have been seated based on the May elections. Despite differing points of view on financial topics between the Board and the FC at times, we work together to ensure that SCA applies appropriate accounting guidance, its financial position remains strong, and assessments remain reasonable.

Owners with business experience, especially those holding a CPA designation, an MBA, or an advanced degree in finance, are encouraged to review the membership qualifications outlined in our charter on the Finance Committee webpage. Emergency Preparedness (EPSG)

Summer Checklist for Preparedness



Rising temperatures and heat extending into the evening hours pose additional risks in the summer regarding emergency preparedness. Refer to these reminders to ensure your household is ready:

1. If you keep your emergency kit in the garage, now is a good time to move it inside, as items deteriorate faster in the heat. Also, consider adding additional water for drinking, cooling, and hygiene to your kit. Summer months require extra hydration and cooling in case of a disruption of water resources. If you do not have an emergency kit or require assistance, visit our website at scaepsg.org.
2. Unless you have air conditioning in the garage, interior temperatures will continue to rise throughout the day and will not drop significantly at night. This creates a potential hazard for some chemicals and containers typically kept in the garage. Review these items, discard any containers or ingredients that have expired, and move any heat-sensitive items inside.
3. Check cooling equipment and the refrigerator to make sure they are maintained and functioning properly to handle the extra heat. Consider placing extra ice packs, towels, and cold beverages in the fridge during the summer. Replace any unreliable appliances or have them repaired before major issues occur.

4. Review the location of main utility connections and shut-off points at home. Make sure they are easily accessible and free of debris or potential hazards in case you need to turn them off. Links to videos on how to perform these tasks are available on our website.
5. Clean grills properly and make sure you have functioning fire extinguishers in easily accessible locations. Replace anything questionable or close to expiration.
6. Prepare a car kit to take with you for trips beyond the immediate area in case traffic incidents require staying in the car for an extended time or leaving the vehicle on foot. The kit should include water, a hat, sunblock, comfortable shoes, snacks, towels, and a cooler with ice. It is a good idea to have printed maps in case you are stranded in an area without cellphone coverage and need to take alternative routes. Do not let your gas or charge drop below a half tank.

DRILL – FIRE AT HOME

- Find a slow week on the calendar and continue with daily activities.
- Observe the location of your cooking equipment, such as the stove, grill, fire pit, and air fryer.
- For each piece of equipment, imagine having an uncontrolled fire. What would you do?
- Calculate how long it would take you to bring a fire extinguisher to each location or to call 911.
- Do you know how to use a fire extinguisher? Remember the **PASS** acronym: **P**ull, **A**im, **S**queeze, **S**wipe at the bottom.
- Inspect cables of the most used equipment in the house. In the event of an electrical fire, can you turn off your main?
- Do you have hoses or buckets in easily reachable locations?
- How would you leave your house if a fire becomes uncontrollable? Do you have a grab-and-go bag? Can you open the garage door without power?

Pick up after your pets

As a reminder, your SCA Activity Card number will be needed to request services.

- Our **Medical Equipment** team maintains and delivers durable medical equipment for loan including canes, crutches, wheelchairs, walkers, shower chairs, and more.
- The **Home Maintenance** team performs certain tasks that residents may not be able to safely do themselves, limited to replacing batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms, light bulbs, house address bulbs, HVAC filters, adding salt to water softeners, and lubricating garage doors.
- CSG's **Transportation team** provides rides locally to healthcare appointments, pharmacies, groceries and the three SCA activity centers. Transportation boundaries have changed to address evolving medical facilities to the West, and diminished resident needs in the Northeast. The Transportation team needs volunteer drivers to take residents to qualified destinations. Please consider joining this dynamic and wonderful team that helps our non-driving seniors thrive here in SCA!
- **Support Groups** provide residents and their families and friends with a forum to share individual experiences, concerns, challenges, and successes. Check the SCA website for dates, times, and locations.
- Our **Communications** team maintains the Assistance Line and connects residents and their requests with the appropriate service and/or support groups.

How fast were you going? One thing I see quite often while I am on patrol is cars going through our villages at a high rate of speed. The speed limit in all our villages is 25 mph, but I see some drivers going much faster, especially on the through roads like Idaho Falls (Black Mountain), Fieldbrook (Mountain View), Olivia Heights (Tall Mesa, Ridgcrest, and Arroyo Vista), and Scotts Valley (Canyon Crest).

Remember, most of our residents cannot move as quickly as they could 20 years ago, and their eyesight—especially depth perception— may not be what it used to be. They could easily step out or pull out in front of you. If you are going too fast, you may not have time to react. When you are flying down our streets, you are endangering everyone, including yourself.

While we are on the subject, stop signs are not optional. Many times I have almost been hit in the patrol car because somebody thinks, “There is never anybody on the street. I do not need to stop.” Yes, you do. Stop means a full stop, not just slowing down and rolling through. Finally, when you are backing out of your driveway, look! There just might be a car coming down your street.

Whether that means calling 311 for non-emergencies or 911 for urgent situations, reporting suspicious activity helps protect everyone.

For those who want to be more involved, there are opportunities to volunteer—from helping at community events to taking on leadership roles. Residents can also attend special presentations

on home security and meet local first responders, including the Henderson Police Department, K-9 units, and SWAT teams, as well as the Henderson Fire Department and Emergency Responders.

Importantly, Neighborhood Watch is for everyone—homeowners and renters alike.

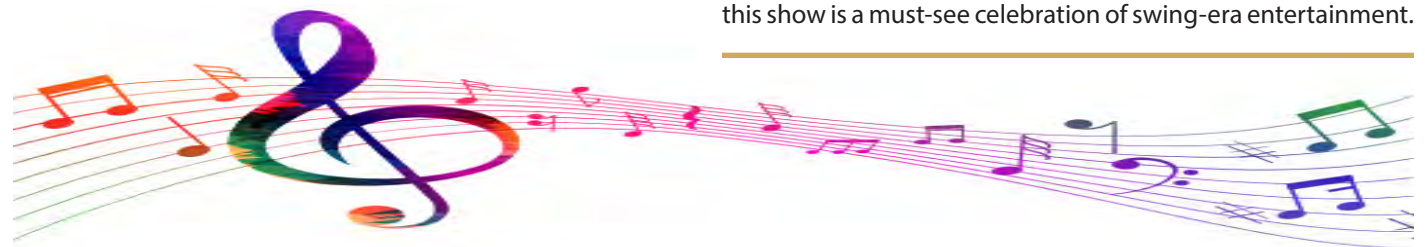

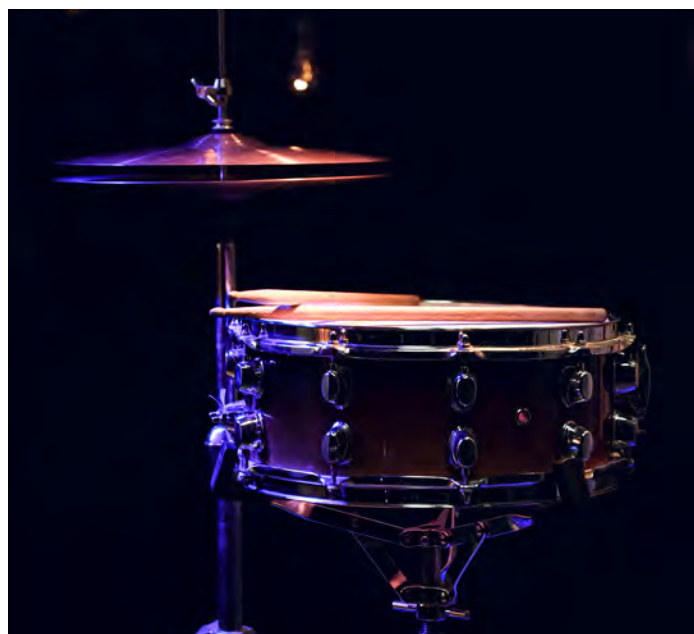

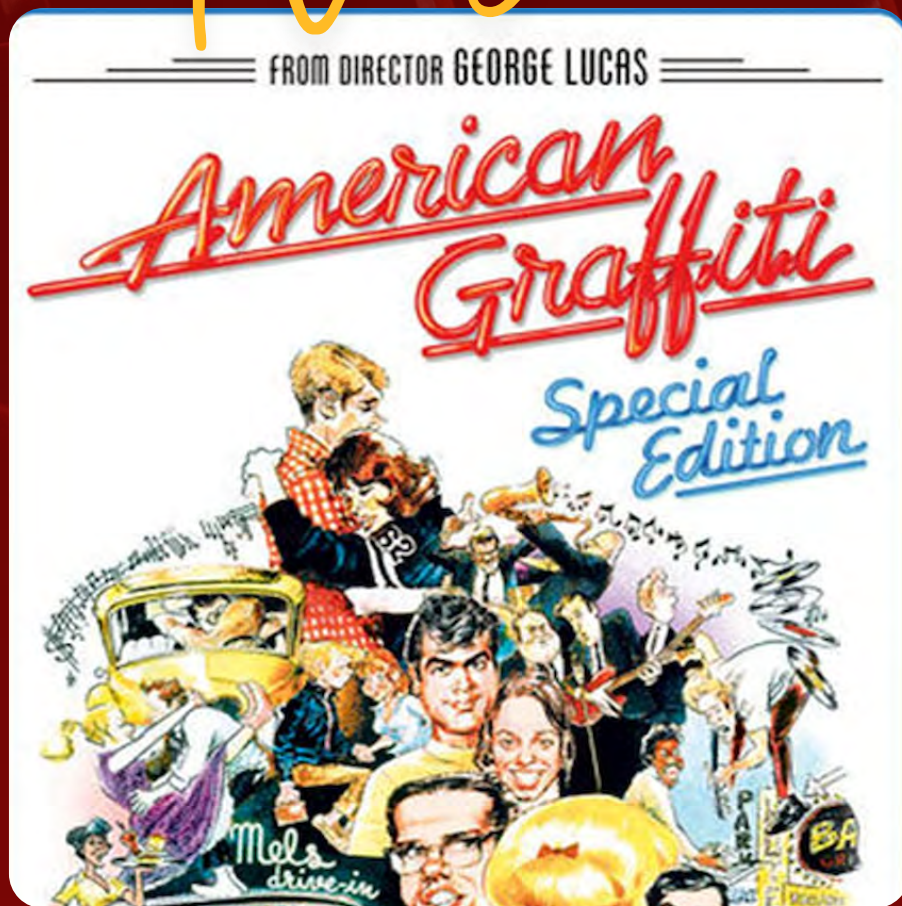

Eating for Better Sleep: Nutrition That Supports Restful Nights

A good night's sleep does not start at bedtime. It starts with what you eat and when. The goal is a calm, comfortable body and steady blood sugar so you can drift off more easily and stay asleep.



Sleep-friendly habits to try

- **Keep dinner light and balanced.** Aim for a balanced meal two to three hours before bed. Include a dinner of half vegetables, a palm of protein (fish, chicken, tofu, or beans), and a portion of whole grains or starchy vegetables.
- **Choose a small evening snack if you are hungry.** Have a simple, non-sugary snack to prevent 2 a.m. wake-ups.
- **Watch alcohol timing.** It can make you sleepy at first but often disrupts deeper sleep later.
- **Cut off caffeine early.** For many adults, caffeine after lunch can linger into the night.

- **Hydrate, then taper.** Drink plenty of fluid earlier in the day to reduce overnight bathroom trips.

- Greek yogurt and berries
- Whole-grain crackers and cheese
- Banana and peanut butter
- Warm milk or soy milk with cinnamon
- Small bowl of oatmeal or whole-grain cereal with milk

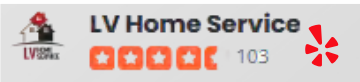
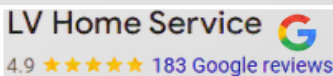

What is Juneteenth? On June 19, 1865, Major General Gordon Granger and his troops arrived in Galveston, Texas, to announce and enforce General Order No. 3. This order proclaimed the freedom of all enslaved individuals in Texas, more than two years after the Emancipation Proclamation was issued. It stated: “The people of Texas are informed that, in accordance with a proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free.”

Juneteenth is a blend of the words “June” and “nineteenth,” but the date carries a much more significant meaning. President Joe Biden signed it into law as a national holiday in 2021. This milestone was reached because of a self-styled little lady in tennis shoes who inspired a movement.

- Opal Lee’s family had been living in their new home for only four days when a mob in Fort Worth, Texas, burned it to the ground in 1939. It was not until decades later that Lee realized the date was June 19. She worked tirelessly to promote recognition of that date.
- In 2016, she walked from Fort Worth, Texas, to Washington, D.C., in a campaign to convince lawmakers to recognize Juneteenth as a national holiday. In 2021, her work was realized.
- Miss Opal Lee, known as the “Grandmother of Juneteenth,” is still alive. Born October 7, 1926.

Juneteenth is a commemoration of the end of slavery in the United States after the Civil War. Today we stand on the shoulders of our ancestors and honor their memory. Happy Juneteenth, everyone. And to all the dads out there, Happy Father’s Day.

FILIPINIANA



We have been enjoying the morning calls of the local birds this spring. Do you know the national bird of the Philippines? It is the Philippine eagle, a critically endangered raptor known for its immense size, striking appearance, and deep cultural significance.

The Philippine eagle is one of the world's largest and most powerful eagles, distinguished by its brown-and-white plumage, massive hooked bill, and a shaggy crest that gives it a regal, almost mythical appearance. It inhabits the mountainous rainforests of Luzon, Samar, Leyte, and Mindanao, with Mindanao hosting the largest remaining population. These forests provide the canopy height the eagle needs for nesting and hunting.

Standing about 3.3 feet tall with a wingspan of roughly 6.5 feet, the Philippine eagle can weigh up to 18 pounds, making it one of the largest eagles on Earth by length and wingspan. Its agility in dense forest environments is remarkable, aided by wings adapted for maneuvering through thick vegetation. Historically called the "monkey-eating eagle," it actually preys on a wide range of animals including civets, flying squirrels, birds, and reptiles, playing a crucial ecological role as an apex predator.

The bird's cultural importance is profound. It was declared the national bird of the Philippines to emphasize its status as a symbol of strength, freedom, and the country's rich biodiversity. It is also featured on the 1,000-peso banknote, further cementing its place in national identity.

Despite its majesty, the Philippine eagle is critically endangered, with fewer than 500 mature individuals estimated to remain in

the wild. The primary threat is habitat loss due to deforestation from logging, agriculture, and mining. Additional pressures include the decline of prey species, environmental degradation, and occasional hunting. Because of its precarious status, killing a Philippine eagle is a criminal offense punishable by up to 12 years in prison and heavy fines. Conservation efforts—such as captive breeding, habitat protection, and public education—are ongoing but face significant challenges.

As a national symbol and ecological guardian, the Philippine eagle represents both the beauty of the country's natural heritage and the urgent need to protect it for future generations.

Jewish tidbits: What is kosher food?

God gave commandments to the Jews regarding foods that are kosher—fit to eat. This is an example of how Judaism is not merely a religion; it is a way of life.

Kosher animals must be slaughtered in a way considered humane. There are also health benefits to keeping kosher, as butchered animals are examined for diseases that make them unfit for eating. For a meat animal to be kosher, it must have split hooves and chew its cud, such as cows and sheep. Pigs do not meet these criteria. Some birds, including chickens, ducks, and turkeys, are kosher, but predators or scavengers like eagles and turkey vultures are not. Fish that have fins and scales, such as salmon and tuna, can be kosher, but shellfish or mammals of the sea are not.

Food such as milk or eggs that comes from a kosher animal is considered kosher. Insects are not.

There are also rules about food preparation and consumption. Dairy and meat must be eaten separately and require separate plates, cookware, and utensils, which are also washed separately. Most fruits, vegetables, and grains are considered kosher, but some, such as raspberries, are restricted because of the possibility of tiny insects being present.

The history of Jewish delis in America. During the 19th century, an influx of Jewish immigrants arrived in New York City from across Europe. Upon arrival, many families began noticing the grocery stores of other immigrant homelands, such as German bakeries and Chinese markets. What began as kosher butcher shops eventually evolved into Jewish delicatessens—a hybrid of butcher services and shops where kosher food products and meals were sold.

Jewish delicatessen and word meaning. To fully appreciate the evolution of Jewish delis in America, one must understand how the word itself reflects a deep community connection. Derived from the French *délicatesse*, meaning "delicious things to eat," the delicatessen offered more than just food; it provided a vital cultural hub where neighbors gathered over cherished traditional flavors.

The growth of New York-style Jewish delis spread rapidly, with approximately 1,500 kosher delis in New York alone during the 1930s. Since then, New York-style Jewish delis have expanded to all major cities across the nation.

Bridge tip

The Michaels cue bid allows you to show two five-card suits at the same time. If an opponent bids a minor suit, you bid the same suit to show five hearts and five spades. If an opponent bids a major suit, you bid the same suit to show five cards in the other major and one of the minor suits.

If there is no intervening bid, the responder bids the suit best fitting the partner's bid with no point requirements. The responder can jump with more than a minimum hand and can bid 2NT if there is support for both minors.

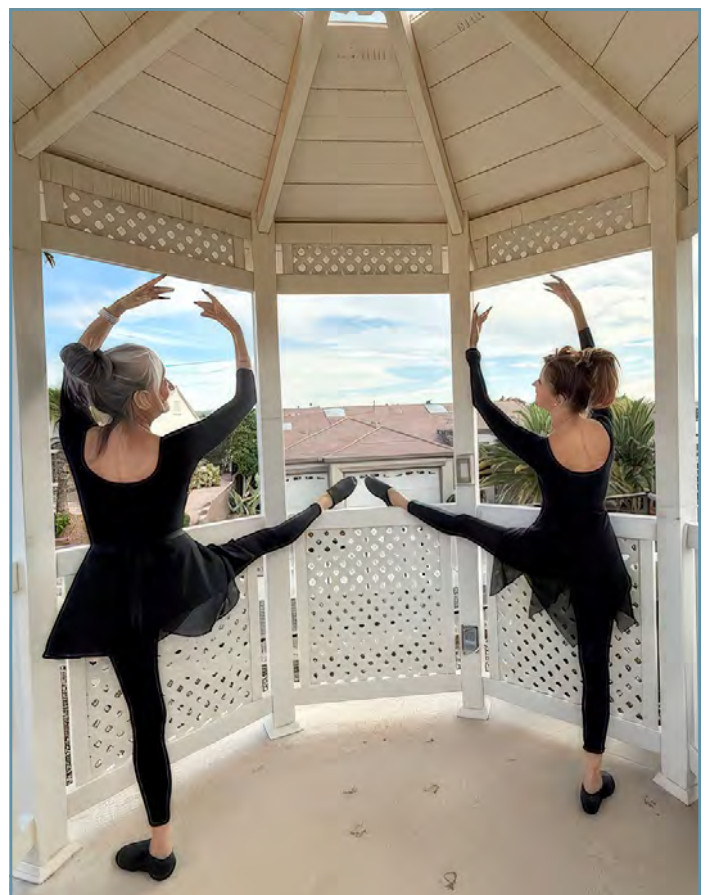

Serve like a pro

A killer pickleball serve is not about brute force; it is about consistency, placement, and disguise. Start with a relaxed grip and

a smooth, low-to-high swing, as tension kills control. Keep the paddle below your waist and strike the ball cleanly out in front; this helps generate a reliable, legal serve every time.

Placement matters more than power. Aim deep into your opponent's backhand corner to limit aggressive returns. Mix it up occasionally by targeting the forehand or adding a slight angle to keep them guessing. Developing a repeatable motion is key, and your serve should feel automatic under pressure.

Use spin strategically. A light topspin can push the ball deeper, while a slice can skid low and disrupt timing. Finally, do not rush. Take a breath, visualize your target, and commit. A confident, well-placed serve sets the tone for the entire rally and quietly puts your opponent on defense from the start.

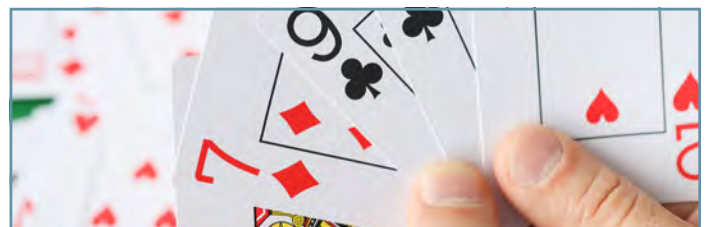
Pinochle is played in partnerships, requiring collaboration and teamwork. If you enjoy friendly competition, the game offers a platform for testing your skills against others.

SCRABBLE



Scrabble is a fascinating game. It was developed in 1931 by Alfred Moshier Butts, an unemployed architect, in New York City. It was relatively unknown until 1952 when Macy's Department Store began selling it and sales skyrocketed. The rest is history. More than 100 million sets have been sold through the years, and currently, there are over 2,447,900 followers on X (formerly Twitter) alone. Scrabble enthusiasts also play the game on Facebook and other online sites. What is the big draw? It is easy to learn and so much fun to play!

The board itself has 225 squares arranged in a unique pattern. There are eight red squares, each of which can earn a Triple Word Score when a letter in your word is placed on one of these squares; 17 pink squares can earn a Double Word Score; 12 dark blue squares can earn a Triple Letter Score; and 24 light blue squares can earn a Double Letter Score. There is a total of 100 letters, including two blanks.

Some people say they are not good spellers, but it really does not matter! Each player draws seven letter tiles, and then each takes a turn making a word. Your word must attach to another word already on the board. You can make small words count significantly when placed on a Triple Letter Score or Triple Word Score. For example, "biz" on a Triple Word Score counts for 42 points. The final scores are usually around 100 to 200 points in a game with four players.

This challenging game can actually improve spelling, lengthen a short attention span, and help develop strategizing skills. Scrabble dictionaries and a cheat sheet are available. Seating is open at each table, and there are no partners. Players can leave at any time after finishing a game. Come and play with us. You are guaranteed a good time!

STRATEGY GAMES



The Strategy Games Club offers many fun and challenging games to suit players of all skill levels. *Players new to modern board games start off with easy games and advance at their own pace.*

Come check out our games library, where we have more than 70 games ranging from easy to complex. At each session, members select games from our cabinets that they wish to play, and others join them. We have something for everyone.

Tile-placement games are some of our members' favorites. In *ALICE'S GARDEN*, you arrange the Tetris-style shapes in

the most advantageous way to score points. Each player has an individual board. The game ends after the round in which a player cannot place a tile from the supply on their player board.

Each round, one player draws one tile shape from bags and players place them on their boards. Players can rotate and flip tiles, but cannot place them outside the grid. Bonus one-element square tiles are awarded for placing gardeners (playing-card image) adjacent to one another; these can be used to plug holes strategically during or at the end of the game.

The game also has an excellent solo mode: You can wander through Alice's garden alone and see what you find. Play is basically the same game with a few tweaks.

Scoring the game is just as straightforward as the rules. It's printed at the bottom of every player's board. Points are awarded for various elements:

- **Chess pieces.** Five points each for pieces on the central path.
- **Roses.** Points based on the size of contiguous areas ranging from one to 25 points.
- **Mushrooms.** Eight points for each column with two or more mushroom squares.
- **Trees.** Points based on the longest distance between neighboring trees in each row.
- **Empty areas.** Each empty area incurs a penalty of five points.
- **Unplaced bonus square tiles.** Each unplaced tile also incurs a five-point penalty.

This is a quick puzzle game with simple setup, but it requires thinking and strategizing without being overwhelming. It's a great game to play with friends.

Don't play the same old games over and over ... and over again. VARIETY IS THE SPICE OF LIFE. Come to one of our club's three weekly sessions, and we'll teach you how to play ALICE'S GARDEN or any of our other games. We meet in Liberty Center on Mondays and Saturdays from 1 to 4 p.m. and Thursdays from 5 p.m. on.

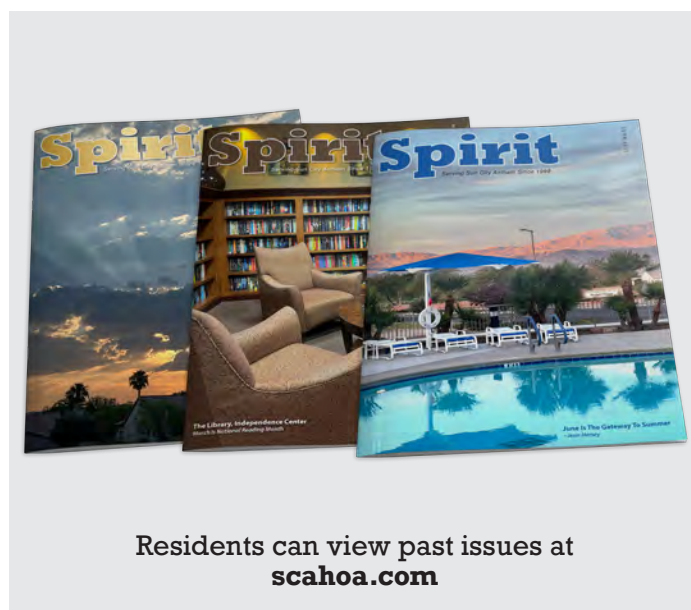
